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Why This Matters

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) provides public assistance to state, tribal, and local government, and certain types of private nonprofit organizations so that communities can quickly respond to and recover from major disasters or emergencies declared by the President. We perform audits of FEMA grantees and sub grantees to determine whether costs claimed under the awards are eligible and allowable under Federal regulations and FEMA guidelines. The City of Raleigh, North Carolina, received an award of \$4.3 million for emergency work resulting from tornadoes and severe storms, which occurred April 16, 2011.
