





The U.S. House of Representatives Committee on Oversight and Government Reform raised concerns regarding the accuracy and completeness of our report entitled *FEMA's Initial Response to the 2016 Catastrophic Flooding in Louisiana* (OIG-17-80-D, June 2017). Based on those concerns, we initiated a quality assurance review of the report, and removed the report from our website on July 19, 2017, pending the results of that review.

The quality assurance review has not been completed, but has determined that the report did not reflect subsequent events that are significant to the audit objective. You should not place any reliance on the June 2017 report.
